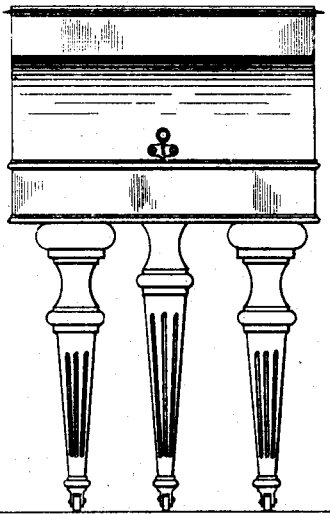
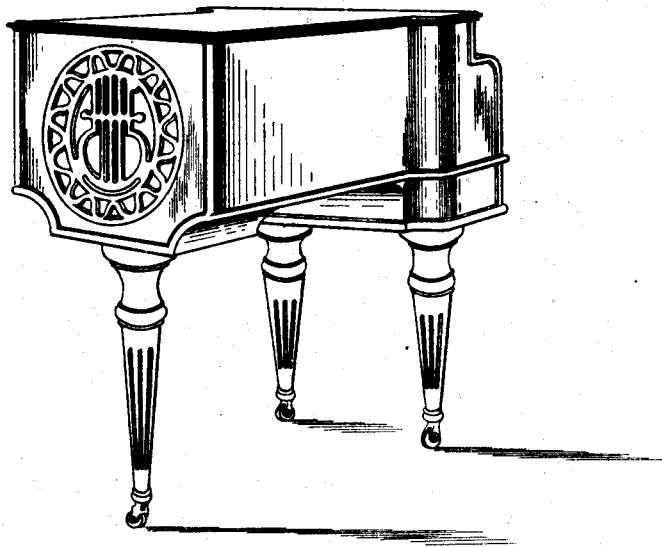

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, THOMAS A. EDISON, a citizen of the United States, residing at Llewellyn Park, West Orange, in the county of Essex and State of New Jersey, have invented a new, original, and ornamental Design for Phonograph-Cabinets, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawings, forming a part thereof.

perspective view of the phonograph cabinet viewed from the rear and showing the design; and Fig. 2 is a front elevation thereof.
